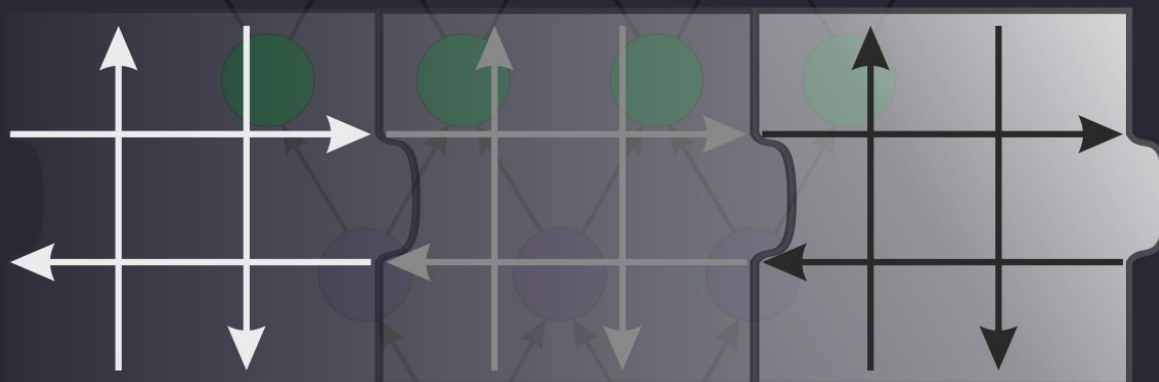

## ANNUAL REPORT 2025

### *Acta Logistica*

This Annual Report presents an overview of the activities of the journal *Acta Logistica* in 2025.

Dear authors, readers, editors, reviewers, and supporters of the journal *Acta Logistica* (AL), the year 2025 was a very successful one for the journal. During this year, *Acta Logistica* (Volume 12) published 70 papers authored by 220 authors and co-authors from 29 countries, receiving a significant number of citations.

The statistics about the journal for the year 2025:

- The journal *Acta Logistica* published 70 peer-reviewed articles.
- 75 contributions were not accepted following the completed review process.
- The total number of contributions received for review in 2025 was 157.
- The published articles involved 220 authors and co-authors from 29 countries, with the following regional distribution:  
Africa: 9.95%, America: 6.79%, Asia: 38.01%, Europe: 45.25%.

We greatly appreciate the work and voluntary contributions of all reviewers of *Acta Logistica*. We also sincerely thank the members of the editorial board for their continuous support, willingness, and dedication to the journal. Once again, thank you all very much.

In 2025, the journal *Acta Logistica* recorded significant global web activity. Based on annual web analytics for the period January 2025 – December 2025, the journal was accessed from more than 118 countries worldwide. The average monthly page views on the journal website [www.actalogistica.eu](http://www.actalogistica.eu) reached 2,800, with an average of 643 visitors per month, including 540 new visitors.

Articles published from 2019 onwards are indexed in the SCOPUS (Elsevier) scientific database. According to the SCImago Journal & Country Rank based on Scopus data for 2024, *Acta Logistica* is positioned as a Q3 journal. The journal achieved:

- SJR indicator: 0.279 (measuring the scientific influence of the average article),
  - SNIP indicator: 0.460 (measuring contextual citation impact),
  - CiteScore: 2.0 (average citations per document).
- Citations per document: 2 years: 1.352, 3 years: 1.375, 4 years: 1.306,  
(Source: SCImago Journal & Country Rank).

Articles published from 2020 onwards are indexed in the Web of Science (Clarivate) – Emerging Sources Citation Index. The Impact Factor, calculated for 2025 based on 2024 data, is 0.9 (Q4 – Engineering, Industrial; Q4 – Management), and the Journal Citation Indicator (JCI) is 0.2.
