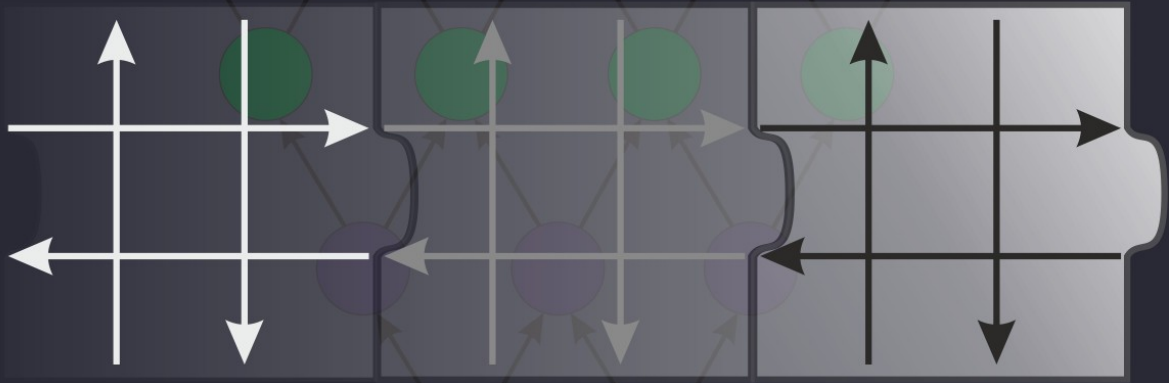

INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS

Acta Logistica

Manuscript: Responsibility for the content of a manuscript rests with the author(s). The editors and the publisher are not responsible for the content of submitted manuscripts. The author(s) must prepare the manuscript and the cover letter in English. Both documents must be prepared electronically using the official templates of *Acta Logistica*. By submitting a manuscript to the journal, the author(s) confirm that they have read and understood all journal policies and requirements stated on the journal website and agree to comply with them.

Peer Review Process: The peer review process consists of several stages. In the first round, the journal editor reviews manuscripts for quality, focus, and suitability. In addition, manuscripts are checked for plagiarism. We use a widely recognised plagiarism detection system. Authors are informed of the results of the plagiarism check by sending a complete originality check document in the form of a PDF file.

Manuscripts that are outside the scope of the journal, do not meet plagiarism requirements, or are of unacceptably low standard and quality are rejected outright without a second round of review. Each manuscript is reviewed in a single-blind process by at least two independent reviewers. We ask our reviewers to complete the evaluation within six weeks. The reviewers will fill out a review form and evaluate the submitted manuscripts. Reviewers will evaluate the following points:

1. The manuscript is relevant for the *Acta logistica* journal.
2. The manuscript is new, interesting, original, and of high quality.
3. The manuscript is prepared clearly, logically and correctly.
4. The language of the manuscript is clear and understandable.
5. The manuscript's figures, diagrams, charts, and tables are readable, clear, and of high quality.
6. The references are used correctly and appropriately.

Based on the reviewers' comments, the editor makes a decision on the article and notifies the authors whether the manuscript is accepted without revision, accepted with minor or major revisions, or rejected. The review process ends with the review of the final version of the article in PDF format and the authors' confirmation of the article for publication in the journal. The journal reserves the right to manage and, where necessary, adapt the review process in accordance with editorial policies. In case of non-compliance with the conditions defined by the journal, the publisher has the right to reject the manuscript.

Publishing Fee: For editorially accepted regular manuscripts of up to 12 pages that will be published in 2026, the publisher requires payment of a **publishing fee of EUR 810**. For each additional page exceeding 12 pages, an extra fee of EUR 30 per page applies.

The publishing fee (Article Processing Charge – APC) becomes payable after editorial acceptance of the manuscript and submission of the final revised version, and prior to publication. No copy editing, typesetting, DOI registration, or publication will take place until the publishing fee has been completed.

The publishing fee covers the complete publication stage, including manuscript processing and publication in one of the forthcoming issues of the journal.

Waiver Policy: The publishing process involves several cost-related activities, including copy editing, article conversion into different formats, online publication, archiving, DOI registration, indexing, data storage management, and journal maintenance.

Acta Logistica operates under an Open Access publishing model. Authors are therefore required to pay an article processing charge (APC) to publish their work with open access under a Creative Commons licence.

The publisher offers fee waivers and discounts on a case-by-case basis. Requests for a full or partial waiver must be submitted **before manuscript submission** and sent by email to info@actalogistica.eu.

Authors requesting a waiver should include the following information:

- Title of the manuscript
- Manuscript type (Research – Scientific; Professional – Practical; Review – Analytical; Educational)
- Name and affiliation of the corresponding author
- Type of waiver requested (full or partial)
- Justification for the waiver request
- Information on research funding

Important notice: Withdrawal of a manuscript, failure to comply with the journal’s publication conditions, or failure to communicate after completion of the peer-review process or after acceptance may be subject to an editorial processing fee. This fee is not a charge for peer review, but a compensation for completed editorial and reviewer work that cannot be reused.

By submitting a manuscript to the journal, the author(s) explicitly acknowledge that they have read and agree to the publishing fee, waiver policy, and editorial processing fee conditions stated above.

Submission Preparation Checklist: As part of the submission process, authors are required to confirm that their manuscript complies with all of the following items. Manuscripts that do not adhere to these guidelines may be returned to the author(s) for correction.

- The manuscript has not been previously published and is not under consideration by another journal (unless an explanation has been provided in the Comments to the Editor).
- Where available, URLs and Digital Object Identifiers (DOIs) for all references have been provided.
- The manuscript has been prepared in accordance with the Instructions for Authors.
- The text complies with the stylistic and bibliographic requirements outlined in the author guidelines, which are available in the “For Authors” section.
- By submitting a manuscript, the author(s) agree to the terms and conditions of the journal *Acta Logistica*.

Ethical Rules: The editorial office or the publisher may reject a manuscript if it is determined that the research was not conducted in accordance with appropriate ethical standards. Plagiarism in any form constitutes a serious violation of the fundamental principles of education, research, and scholarship and will not be tolerated. This policy applies to all authors, editors, and reviewers involved in the journal *Acta Logistica* (AL) and defines their ethical responsibilities. Ethical misconduct includes, but is not limited to, plagiarism, data falsification, fabrication of results, misuse of third-party materials, and fraudulent authorship. The publisher, 4S go, s.r.o., applies ethical principles to all its published journals in accordance with the guidelines of the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE) and the Elsevier Publishing Ethics Resource Kit.

Manuscript Preparation: The original manuscript should be submitted electronically in a single-column format with single-line spacing. The manuscript should be prepared using Times New Roman font, size 10 pt. The page size must be A4 with standard margins of 2.5 cm on all sides. The manuscript should range from a minimum of 4 to a maximum of 12 pages, including figures, tables, charts, and attachments. A final manuscript that **exceeds 12 pages** may be returned for abridgement. All manuscripts must be written in correct English. In addition, the manuscript must follow a standard scientific structure, including an Introduction, Methodology, Experimental Section, Results and Discussion, and Conclusions.

The text of the manuscript should include the following:

- Title: as short as possible, with no abbreviations or acronyms.
- Address: position, department, name of institution, full postal address of each author.
- E-mail: e-mail address of each author.
- Keywords: the limit is min. 3 and max. 5 words or phrases. Keywords are important for online searching.
- Abstract: the maximum length is 250 words.
- Main text: contains information about new knowledge that has been obtained through research, study, or the proposal of solutions to project tasks.
- Acknowledgements and notice: this section contains information about the source documents from which the manuscript is made.
- Figures and figure captions: all illustrations, whether diagrams or photographs, are referred to as Figures. All figures have a description below the figure. All figures can be made in colours. Figures must be prepared in high quality and must be computer-drafted or digitised with a resolution of at least 300 dpi. Figures must be numbered sequentially. Please prepare all figures, especially line diagrams, to the highest possible standards.
- Tables and table's captions: all tables must have a caption placed above the table. All tables can be made in colours. Tables must be numbered sequentially. Please prepare all tables to the highest possible standards.
- Units of measurement: *Acta Logistica* - International Scientific Journal follows the International System of Units (SI).
- References: All journal titles must be provided in full; abbreviated journal titles are not accepted. A maximum of one citation from the journal *Acta Logistica* is permitted. Full references should include all author names and initials, the date of publication, the title of the article or book, the title of the publication (italics), the volume and issue number (of a journal), the publisher and form (books, conference proceedings) and page numbers. If authors have a problem preparing the references list, you can use the online service www.citethisforme.com with citation style **IEEE**.
